# TREMOR IN HOLLINGER FELT THRUOUT THE LIST

Dome Extension the Only Instance of Buoyancy in Porcupines-General List Recorded Further Declines-Big Slump in Hol-

World Office, Friday Evening, April 12. A sudden drop in Hollinger, which wiped out practically all the gain the shares had made this week, and a sharp rally in Dome Extension that nearly made up the loss occasioned by yesterday's decline, were the features in the local mining exchanges to-day. Elsewhere trading was inclined to lethargy, and prices developed further weakness in consequence of the rather flat demand from the outside interests.

The movement in Hollinger was accepted as representative of the efforts of the bear contingent to dislodge weakly-held stock taken on during the recent 4 upturn. At the opening the shares sold at \$12.60, a loss of 15 cents from last night, and from that time on the incoming of a large volume of li-quidating orders kept the price on the downgrade. Before the declines cul-minated the stock had dropped to \$12.05. a. net loss of 70 cents a share from last night's close

Dome Extension Star Performer The advance in Dome Extension was as rapid as it was extensive. The first sale was put thru at a gain of two points over last night, and in the early dealings the stock got up further, touching 71, which was the high level for the day. Later on, the influence of the big decline in Hollinger gave a tremor to the whole market, but Dome Extension held up well, and closed firm at 70 bid. sale was put thru at a gain of two

The other cheaper Porcupine issues were characterized by much the same recessionary trend that marked their existence yesterday. A decline tendency was in effect from the opening of the exchanges, and losses of greater or less magnitude were occasioned.
