Japanese restaurant-keepers have suffered indignities in San Francisco as well as Japanese school children, according to reports received by the Japanese ambassador from the Japanese consular officials in that city.

At least seven or eight reports have been made concerning a boycott in augurated against Japanese restaurants in the California city. Agents have been posted to prevent patrons from entering the restaurants, and in several instances stones have been thrown and windows broken, according to the statements of Japanese officials.

These cases have been brought to the attention of Secretary Root by Viscount Aoki, who says it is with great reluctance that he brings to the attention of the central government demonstrations against the Japanese, which are purely local in their nature.

Viscount Aoki said that all the trouble has been confined to San Francisco. The ambassador assured his government again to-day that the outbreak against the Japanese is purely local, and was much gratified at receiving despatches which showed that the Japanese peen is for the most part attempting to check the feeling against Americans.
