STEEL STRIKE SHOWS TRUST IN LEAD; SETTLEMENT OF TRACKMEN'S IS NEAR

According to Latest Figures But 56,400 Men Obeyed Shaffer's Orders, While 76,000 Refused to Strike—General Chairmen of Railway Orders Form a Board of Conciliation to Confer With General Manager McNICOLL.

STEEL STRIKE.

Pittsburg, Aug. 12.—Neither side moved decisively to-day in the great industrial conflict between employers and employees in the steel trade, and the result is still in the balance.

The strikers made gains at Pittsburg, McKeesport, Wheeling and Delafield in the last 24 hours, but in the main the advantage is still with the mill owners.

Both sides claim to be preparing moves that will bring confusion to opponents, but neither side had shown its hand.

The general situation to-night can be summarized as follows:

Ten men, five of them skilled, quit at the lower mill works of the Carnegie Company in Pittsburg to-day and joined the strikers.

Their defection represents the first break in the Carnegie forces of more than 15,000 men.

The strikers were jubilant over the incident, but the company claims to have filled their places at once, and that there will be no more desertions at any of the plants.

The Beltsville plant, at which men struck on Sunday, was finally closed down to-day, after working about half yesterday afternoon.

When another start will be made is problematical. Several hundred boys employed at the National Tube Works at McKeesport went out during the night and day and their act materially aided the effort of the strikers to finally tie up the plant.

The works are going ahead short-handed, but the ranks of the workers are thinning, and the supply of material is limited.

The strikers made gains at Wheeling, and the steel officials admitted to-day that the Bessemer would be closed down. Clark's mill here is moving along full-handed.

Lind say & McCutcheon are operating with a small crew, and the managers are planning to open Planters and increase the force at Linders & McCutcheon.

McNICOLL'S OFFER.—A break in the ranks of the men who struck at Planters is expected, but the strikers deny that one will occur.

Another break is reported as possible at the Newcastle, but there is as yet no positive indication that the American Tin Plate Company has a small force at the Crescent plant in Cleveland, and is also planning resumption at other points with non-union men.

The Steel Corporation has ordered that the Charters plant at Carnegie be dismantled at other points with non-union men.

So far, good order has prevailed, although the steel officials assert that there has been some indication of a strike at the Carnegie plant.

Both sides express their confidence in ultimate victory, and are actively carrying forward their respective campaigns. The number of men out as a result of the general order is now roughly estimated at 9000, and the strikers are 56,400.

Many strikers have found work in independent mills at other occupations, and more are merely idle because the skilled men are out.

According to an authoritative announcement made to the representative of the Associated Press by officials of the American Steel Steel Company, the destruction of another plant has been ordered by the steel corporation as a result of the refusal of the men to operate it.

This time it is the Charters plant at Carnegie that is to be dismantled. It is owned by the American Steel Steel Company, and the orders to tear it down went out last afternoon. It will be removed to Leechburg in the Kiskiminnick Valley.

"I am satisfied with the result," said the representative of the American Steel Steel Company, "and we will have no reports from Chicago and West. I will leave to-morrow morning for Wheeling, and Mr. Pittsfield will see to it that I will return from there."

BOY TAKEN WITH CRAMPS PASSED FACTORIES BILL

STONY LAKE CLAIMS VICTIM.
