BAD MAN DEAD

After Terrific Chase in Chicago

Desperado.

Chicago, Aug. 3. — The locality of Archer avenue and Loomis street became the stamping ground yesterday of a realistic "wild west" performance that resulted in a negro ex-convict being shot to death by a policeman after a chase in the course of which the negro put a bullet into the inevitable innocent bystander.

The fight lasted half an hour to the accompaniment of a fusillade of gunfire proceeding not only from the various

father had gone away, the girl looked down a grating in front of the store and saw a negro more than six feet in height skulking in the basement. She was frightened.

Lurks Behind Boxes

The negro's reply was a shot from a revolver and a jump from behind the boxes to get a better aim for the second shot. The policeman drew his revolver and the fighting pair were

Both were shooting fast. One bullet ripped its way through the door of the store, increasing the terror of the girls inside.

Henry A. Noyes, 32 years old, 222 South Sangamon street, who was delivering crackers to a store close by, ran out to catch his horse, which had become frightened. A bullet from the negro's revolver struck Noyes in the groin, inflicting what may turn out to be a fatal wound.

Dr. E. A. Sachtleben, 2843 Archer avenue turned himself into an ambulance corps and started Noyes for the Baptist Hospital while the fight continued. Policemen turned up from various directions and joined in the chase.

Others Open Fire.

An employee of James & Burdick, 2840 Archer avenue, ran to the negro but recoiled when he saw the smoking muzzle of the de-

When the fugitive and his pursuers reached Bonfield street and Arch avenue, employees of the Standard Sausage Company opened fire at the negro.

Pretty nearly everybody in the neighborhood who owned a gun—and that was a good many—came out and took shot, according to the stories told by spectators afterwards.

The negro had a plentiful supply of cartridges, and reloaded his weapon as he ran.

Sergeants C. K. Herts and Patrolman Morgan W. O'Connell, in charge of a patrol wagon, caught up with the fight at Loomis street and Hill

ran west about 100 feet on Hill avenue and turning into a yard, continued his fight through a vacant lot to Twenty-Fifth street. The policemen were close behind, O'Connell leading.

Shot Down at Last.

In front of the storehouse of People's Gaslight Coke Company negro tried to jump over a fence, the police were too close. He turned and snapped his revolver in the face of Patrolman O'Connell, but the weapon was empty. O'Connell shot three

The police said that in the negro pockets they found parole papers from the Joliet penitentiary giving the name of William Wood, 34 years old, in

June 30. The man had been in prison about five years for burglary. The body was taken to the county morgue.
