WASHINGTON, March 28.—The work of the Forest Service in gathering statistics for foreign products for the past year has furnished the basis for a provisional statement of the wood consumed in the manufacture of paper pulp. As the accompanying table shows, the returns from 159 firms, controlling 232 pulp mills, give over 3,000,000 cords as the total amount of wood used:
