# PLANS OF C.P.R. ANNOUNCED

Mr. Downie Speaks of Work on His Division—Generous Appro

The appropriations for expenditures on the Atlantic Division of the C. P. R. during the present year which have been reeived by the general superintendent, William Downie, show that this division has been treated very generously and that during the next season a very large amount of money will be spent in making rovements to the line.

The work includes the relaying of about thirty miles of track on the main line of the division with eighty-five pound rails replacing eighty pound rails, which have been slightly worn. About the same amount of rails will be laid on the branch times, replacing the present with heavier parliamentary secretary of the home office. His new position is a stepping stone to

A large jount of work will also be undertaken in e way of ditching, fencing, replacing culerts, erecting new section houses, installing electric crossing signals, etc. The sums avolved range from small to very large amounts and the aggregate means the expenditure of a big sum.

There will be no work replacing bridges or culverts on the main line, as all the structures of this kind, between here and Montreal are now in permanent shape, being built of steel, concrete and masonry. The station houses are also in such good condition that there are none to be replaced this year.
