

# DOWN TO DETAILS IN THE

REGIPROCITY CONFERENCE

(Staff Correspondence of Toronto Globe).

Washington, Jan. 11—The outlook for a successful termination to the Canadian American trade negotiations now pending is considerably brighter tonight. Hon. Mr. Fielding and Hon. Mr. Paterson conferred with Secretary Knox for almost three hours this afternoon, and when they separated there was a much more optimistic tone in the little circle of diplomats. For the first time since the conference started the Canadian ministers called to the meeting their two departmental assistants—namely, John MacDougall, deputy minister of customs, who was summoned from Ottawa, and James A. Russell, the tariff expert of the finance department. The presence of these men indicates that the negotiations have passed the initial stages, and are on a basis more likely to lead to something definite.
