EIGHT HUNDRED HITS

IN TABRIZ FIGHTING

TABRIZ, Aug. 6.—There has now been thirty-five days' fighting in the streets of Tabriz and the casualties due chiefly to bombs, thrown from mortars and shrappel, are estimated at 800.
