## MR. LUMSDEN TAKES STAND

Heard by Committee in Support of Charges  
—Totus Absent.

OTTAWA, March 10.—The common committee on the Lumsden charges with the striking opposition members still absent and only the four Liberal members present took the evidence of Mr. Lumsden in support of the charges at 4 o'clock this afternoon and evening. He was examined by Mr. Cryer, and at the conclusion of his evidence stated that he could think nothing further to say in substantiation of his charge. Practically nothing more was brought out than was submitted by Mr. Lumsden in his written statement presented at the first meeting of the committee. His letters announcing his resignation to the government and charging over classification and a general disregard of his instructions with regard to proper observation of specifications were submitted in evidence.
