In deference to the desire of the British cabinet the Newfoundland legislature will meet in special session on Feb. 15th to respecting the treaty shore. The session will probably occupy only one day as the country is unanimous in supporting such a proposal. The regular session of the legislature for general business will be convened about the middle of April.
