London, Nov. 13.—This week marks the auniversary of the Bolshevik advent. When a year ago news of their rising was first heard the general prediction was it would be very short. But it has lasted a year, and the destinates of Russia depend on men who are notoriously in German pay and who crush every opposition with the Bercest means.
