Good farm-horses cannot now be bought for

Live Stock in Scotland

less than fifty to eighty pounds, the same animals, or animals of the same class, bringing, twelve to fifteen years ago, not more than half these figures. Many farmers who have good grazing lands are now breeding their own horses, which they find generally to serve their purpose better than the horses they buy away from home. Cows which twenty years ago sold at from ten to twelve pounds go sold at from ten to twelve ago sold at from ten to twelve pounds are now worth from twenty to thirty; these are the common Fifeshire breed, fancy stock of course, bringing much more money, and what are called "fancy prices." Good three-year old cattle, ready for the knife of the butcher, have been selling, of late, as high as thirty to sxty pounds; two year old "cattle beasts," twenty-five to forty pounds; yearlings, ten to twenty pounds, and young calves at from two to ten. Sheep are at present remarkably high, and are are at present remarkably high, and are bringing in the markets double the prices they brought six or eight years ago. The high prices received for all kinds of edible farm stock can be accounted for by the advance in wages generally throughout the country, and the greater consumption of animal food by laborers
