at the present time. We hope, therefore, our friends, & in particular the members of our Church, will not fail to avail themselves of this means of supplying themselves and their families with these useful publications.

The number in society in this Conference, is 4,087. We have admitted on trial Seven men of promising talents and usefulness, and two located Preachers have been restored and made efficient.

Upon a review of the whole, we feel that we have great reason to thank God, and take courage. Dear Brethren, let us have your prayers, that the spirit of the Lord, may go up, with each of us to his respective field of labour.

"Now the God of Peace, that brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, make you perfect in every good work, to do his will, working in you that which is well pleasing, through Jesus Christ; to whom be glory for ever and ever, Amen."
