GEORGES HENRI BLOUIN

Mr. Blouin was born in Montreal in 1921; he attended the Collège Sainte-Marie and the University of Montreal from which he received a B. A. degree in 1944 and an LL. B. in 1948. While at the University of Montreal he was on the staff of "Le Quartier Latin" and became, in 1948, its editor-in-chief.

Mr. Blouin began his career with the Public Service in 1948 in the Income Tax Division of the Department of National Revenue. The following year he joined the Department of External Affairs and saw service abroad in New Delhi, San Francisco, Athens and Brussels. In September 1965, he was appointed Canadian Ambassador to Cameroun and since September 1967, has been Minister at the Canadian Embassy in Washington.

Mr. Blouin is married to Denise Angers and they have two children.

FREEMAN MASSEY TOVELL

Born in Toronto in 1918, Mr. Tovell studied at the University of Paris, at the University of Toronto from which he received a B. A. and at Harvard University from which he received an M. A.

During the war Mr. Tovell joined the Royal Canadian Navy. He served in the Western Atlantic and in the United Kingdom, and was dischared in 1945 as a Lieutenant.

Mr. Tovell joined the Department of External Affairs in January 1945 and shortly afterwards was posted to Lima. Subsequent assignments abroad were in Copenhagen and in Washington. In 1962 he was appointed Canadian Ambassador to Peru and Bolivia. Since October 1965 Mr. Tovell has been on duty in Ottawa and in 1967 he was named Director General of Personnel.
