



To fasten a loose broom handle; make a slantwise hole with a brad-awl, dip a nail in water, and drive it through the handle into the head. The nail will rust and hold more firmly in consequence.

POT l'OURRI.—Put into a jar rose leaves and buds, a little mint, lemon, thyme, a few bay leaves, a little lavender and rind of a lemon, a few cloves, and sprinkle some powdered bay salt between the layers of the sweet smelling flowers. Fill the jar as you get the flowers, and sprinkle salt as you fill it up.

VICTORIA CARE.—Rub six ounces of butter well into a pound of flour; then mix six ounces of sugar; beat two eggs and make with the above into a paste. Roll it very thin, and cut with the top of a glass; prick them with a fork, and cover with caraway seeds, or wash with the white of an egg, and dust a little white sugar over.

SPONGE CREAM.—Take one pint of fresh milk, three tablespoonfuls of gelatine, three tablespoonfuls of sugar, three eggs. Put the gelatine into cold milk, let it stand a little while, put on the stove and bring to boiling point, then add the sugar and yolks of eggs, well beaten together; temove from the fire and stir in the whites, also beaten stiff; add a little salt, flavour to suit, and pour into moulds; wet first, so that the cream will turn out easily. out easily.

BRUISES IN FURNITURE. - Wet the BRUISES IN FURNITURE. — Wet the bruised part with warm water; double a piece of brown paper five or six times, soak it and lay it on the place; apply on that a hot iron till the moisture is evaporated. If the bruise is not removed repeat the process. After two or three applications the dent or bruise will be raised level with the surface. If the bruise is small merely soak it with warm water and apply a red-hot poker near the surface; keep it continually wet, and in a few minutes the bruise will disappear.

When baked, spread over the top a layer of jelly or preserves. Beat the whites of eggs dry, and add two tablespoonfuls of sugar, and spread over the top; return to stove, and bake a light brown. Serve warm with sauce, or cold with sugar and cream. cold with sugar and cream.

SWEET PICKLE FOR RIPE CUCUMBERS.-Pare and cut to any desired shape, put in a pan and pour boiling water over them; add a handful of salt and let stand over night, then drain off the water, pour over good vinegar to which spices to the taste have been added, more of cinnamon than any other (I always use whole spices and tie up in a cloth), let the whole stand on the stove and simmer two hours. Species with a cound simmer two hours. Sweeten with a nound of sugar to a quart of vinegar, and you will have a sweet pickle which everyhody will relish, and which an invalid may est with impunity.
