Dear Mr. Larkin:

You may be interested in seeing the enclosed copy of the report I made to the Trustees of the Rockefeller Foundation on my work of a year ago. Please do not trouble to acknowledge it. You will observe that the report is sent in from The Roxborough, Ottawa, and that it contains mention of the fact that my engagement with the Foundation is on the distinct understanding that I should retain my place of residence and citizenship in Canada, and my interest in Canadian public affairs; also that on the Foundation's part the stipulation was that the work was to be in no way confined to any one country, but that I was to be perfectly free in pursuing my investigations, if I desired to do so, in any part of the world.

I attach also a small pamphlet indicating the nature of the several Rockefeller philanthropies. A reference to my own work is made on pages 30 and 31, from which you will see that there is no misunderstanding on the part of any persons connected with the
