- Jan. 29 Two Canadian naval officers, serving with the Royal Navy's Fleet Air Arm, have been mentioned in despatches for "air strikes" against the German battleship Admiral Von Tirpits in August, 1944. They are Lieutenant R. H. Gray, Welson, B.C., and Lieutenant J. F. Ross, Trure, W.S. Announced at the same time was the award of the D.S.C. to Lieutenant R. Ross Campbell of Toronte, who was in command of a motor torpedo boat.
- Jan. 30 The Bangor class minesweeper "Clayequet" has been torpedeed and sunk in the northwest Atlantic and eight of her complement of 81 are reported missing.
- Jan. 31 The Canadian-manned frigate "Teme" was rammed amidships by an aircraft carrier and almost sliced in half while operating with sub-hunting Canadian and British escort groups and Royal Navy Carriers in the Bay of Biscay. Damage to the "Teme", one of the Royal Navy's river class frigates which has been manned by Canadian personnel, has been repaired and she is now back in operations. Casualties were slight.
- Jan. 31 The Honourable Angus Macdonald and Vice Admiral G.C. Jones to-day ended a tour of shore establishments in the United Kingdom of the R.C.N.
- Feb. 2 The Royal Camadian Navy Show, at present touring England, has received a great deal of praise from English critics.
- Feb. 2 "U-boat activity in the North Atlantic is increasing", said the Honourable Angus Macdonald, who arrived back from Britain to-day. "They have increased of late, it is true, but they are not so menacing as they were in 1941 and 1942".
- Feb. 4 Formal recruiting for the W.R.C.N.S. will end February 7.
- Feb. 6 Captain F. S. Hart, Naval Chief of Staff of the Pacific Command, has ordered an inquiry into allegations that girl members of a United States Coastguard Show were molested by Canadian Naval ratings during a cruise in Vancouver Harbour on Sunday.
