The contingent to be employed in the United Kingdom could either be attached to the London Fire Brigade or the fire brigades of large provincial cities. In bodies of, say, low or more, for general service in the brigade, or be organised as more or less independent units operating under central or regional control, for special fire fighting duties. In either case, the contingent would be employed as reinforcing units in support of local brigades in case of serious outbreaks of fire. They should come under their own officers and could wear their own uniforms or be provided with Auxiliary Fire Service uniforms, with a distinctive badge, as may be preferred.
