Mr. Heap-

Q. Do you know the lot on the east side of the river, occupied or owned at the time of the transfer, or about then by Adam Cochran? A. Yes.

Q. Is that the Adam Cochran that you mentioned in your evidence this morning? A. A brother.

Q. Did Adam Cochran's lot lie to the south or north of Alexander Cochran's?

A. Adams lot is north of Alexander's lot.

Q. Which was the northerly lot of these two, Adams or Alexander's? A. Adam is living just now at the present time on the north of Alexander Cochran, but he owned the lot on the south side formerly, you see.

Q. On the south side of Alexander Cochran's present lot?

A. Yes, but he is living now----

Q. At the time of the transfer where was Adam Cochran's lot?

A. I think he owns both lots.

Q. Which? A. The south of Alexander, he was living there south of Alexander Cochran's lot with his father in law, Alexander Thomas.

Q. On the lot immediately south of Alexander Cochran's?

A. Yes, but I don't say that he was living there at the time of the transfer, he lived there at one time but I could not say where he lived at the time of the transfer but he owned these lots before the transfer.

Q. At the very time of the transfer was anyone living on this lot immediately south of Alexander Cochran's lot?

A. No, I don't think it. Oh yes, there was a house there by Henry Cochran's father but I could not say who lived on it.
