Sir,

I have the honor to request that you will report as fully and as soon as possible, upon the following points:-

1. Description, as accurate as possible, of nature and position (giving name, if any) of any lake or stream on any of the Reserves in your Agency where you consider it probable that the spawn of the German Carp might be deposited, with a fair prospect of successful development, and to the benefit of the Indians, if matured.

To assist you in the formation of your opinion with regard to this fish, I may inform you that it thrives in ponds, and must not be associated with pike.

2. As to whether you think that the spawn of any other fish might be introduced, with the probability of successful cultivation.

3. As to what quantity of any kind of spawn it would be advisable to have sent to you, to deposit in the waters deemed eligible for experiment.
