- Why did you keep that Pay Book, Harvey?
- Because I was coming back to the Army. Q-

training had you completed?

- Well, I was doing my G.M.T., sir.
- After you completed your training, you

were willing to go overseas, were you?

CROSS-EXAMINED BY THE PROSECUTOR:

Harvey, you became absent without leave at 2000 hours on the 28th July, 1944, is that correct?

That is correct, sir, I believe it is.

You remained absent without leave until

you were apprehended?
