A. L.11, sir.

Q.165 Do you know the accused in this case?

A. Yes, sir.

Q.166 Do you see him here this morning?

A. Yes, sir. (indicates accused).

Q.167 Do you recall seeing him early in March of this year?

A. Yes, he used to work in the kitchen with us.

Q.168 Were you in the kitchen in L.11 on or about March 10 this year?

A. Yes, sir.

Q.169 Was Gnr. Lecompte there?

A. I just don't recall, sir.

Q.170 Do you know Bdr. Waterfield?

A. Yes, sir.

Q.171 Was he there?

A. I think he was, sir.

Q.172 Was anyone else there?

A. I don't recall, sir.

Q.173 You have told us you remember being in L.11 on the 10 March 1944. Were you there on the night of the 10th?

A. Yes, sir.

Q.174 Did anything unusual take place?

A. There was a bit of a quarrel.

Q.175 Would you tell the Court what you know about that, what you saw?

A. I was in there and L/Cpl. Richmond and Gnr. Lecompte were fighting there and next thing I knew Bdr. Waterfield and Bdr. Daniels came in. I guess Lecompte must have been hurting Cpl. Richmond. Waterfield told Lecompte to go back to his hut or he would put him under arrest. Lecompte wouldn't go so Waterfield told him to go again, and he still wouldn't go, so Gnr. Lecompte attacked Bdr. Daniels and pushed him past the room. Daniels got a wrist lock on him and put him on the floor. He asked Gnr. Lecompte to be quiet and he would let him up, which he did. Then he attacked Cpl. Richmond again and then they moved out of sight. There are two parts to the kitchen and they went in the other part.

Q.176 How long did you remain in L.11?

A. I was in there about an hour.

Q.177 You have told us what you saw. You told us they went into another part of the building. How long did you remain in L.11 after that?

A. I heard Bdr. Waterfield say, we will take him to the Guard Room and they took him and I went home.
