ing of the Association, nor shall any of its Fleet be allowed to compete in any Race held under the auspices of the Association.

SEC. 2. No Sailing Skiff or small Yacht, the owner or representative of which is not in good standing in the Club to which he is supposed to belong, shall be entitled to compete in any Race held under the auspices of the Association.

CORINTHIANISM.

Corinthianism in yachting is that attribute which represents participation for sport as disti. It from gain, and which also involves the acquirement of nautical experience through the love of sport rather than through necessity or hope of gain, in this respect the following general definition is given:—"No person who follows the sea as a means of livelihood, or who has accepted remmeration for services rendered in handling or serving on a yacht or skiff, or who is a professional boat-builder, shall be considered a Corinthian yachtsman, or shall be eligible to steer a boat in any races held nude; the auspices of this Association."
