RULES AND REGULATIONS.

LONG DISTANCE TELEPHONY.

Connections outside the Local Exchange may be obtained by asking for the Long Distance Operator.

Direct telephonic communication can be had with all the principal cities, towns and villages in the Provinces of Quebec and Ontario and the United States. A list of offices connected by the long distance lines of this Company in the Provinces of Ontario and Quebec will be found in this book.

Regular tariff rates will be charged subscribers for each connection from their telephones to points outside the local exchange limits. When a particular person is desired, the name must be given to the Long Distance Operator with the call; otherwise, charge will be made for connecting the station asked for, and for the full time the line is held, whether the party required is obtained or not. Non-subscribers who desire the use of subscribers' telephones should be referred to the Public Stations of the Company.

When a conversation on a toll line exceeds the time unit allowed, the extra charge for overtime will be added to the rate in all cases.

Upon request, and the pre-payment of reasonable charges, a messenger will be sent when possible to notify a non-subscriber to come to any Public Station of the Company.

Written messages of twenty words or under, over the lines of the Bell Telephone Company of Canada, are taken at the following tariff, charge for delivery extra:

DISTANCES-

Up to 15 miles	-	
From 15 to 150 miles	-	
From 150 to 225 miles	50	cents

Each additional twenty words, or fraction thereof, one-half the above tariff.

All conversations, messages or messenger service must be prepaid.

Messages are received and repeated as understood by the Company's operators, and the company will not be liable for mistakes or delays in transmitting, or delivery, or for failure to transmit or deliver the same beyond the amount of the charges paid to the Company.
