

**BEAVERTON, ONT.**—The Village of Beaverton and Township of Thorah will jointly erect a town hall here to cost \$10,000.

**LETHBRIDGE, ALTA.**—The Rector of Knox church has left for Winnipeg to have plans prepared for a new church to cost \$20,000.

**STRATHCLAIR, MAN.**—Barton & Holman, architects, Winnipeg, are calling for tenders for a brick veneer hotel to be erected here.

**SELKIRK, MAN.**—The Winnipeg, Selkirk & Lake Winnipeg Railway will shortly commence the erection of a power house here.

**WALKERVILLE, ONT.**—The Standard Chain Co., of Pittsburg, are negotiating for the purchase of a site on which to erect a factory.

**FREDERICTON, N.B.**—It is understood that the Provincial Government will construct a new bridge at the mouth of the St. John river.

**TILLSONBURG, ONT.**—The W. H. Wilson Co. are having plans prepared for the rebuilding of their factory, which was recently damaged by fire.

**WESTON, ONT.**—E. R. Babington, architect, Toronto, is preparing plans for a brick and stone factory for the Sanitary Packing Co., cost \$18,000.

**NEEPAWA, MAN.**—A new fire hall is to be erected in this village.—The Village Council will endeavor to obtain a supply of water from Park Lake.

**BRUSSELS, ONT.**—The ratepayers have carried a by-law authorizing the erection of a Carnegie library building.—A new fire hall is also to be erected.

**KENORA, ONT.**—It is probable that the ratepayers will shortly vote on a by-law providing for the erection of a new High school building to cost \$26,000.

**COLLINGWOOD, ONT.**—J. Wilson, architect, will receive tenders up to April 23rd for erection of four roomed school building. Plans at office of architect.

**ST. MARY'S, ONT.**—By-laws providing for a loan of \$6,000 to Wier & Wier and bonus of \$5,000 to Straus & Roos have been defeated by the ratepayers.

**WALKERTON, ONT.**—J. P. Klempf will receive tenders up to April 20th for erection of an addition to the Lutheran church. Plans at Royal Hotel.

**RATHWELL, MAN.**—A deputation from this town recently waited on the Provincial Parliament with reference to the construction of a waterworks system.

**BATH, N.B.**—A deputation will shortly wait on the New Brunswick Government agitating the construction of a bridge over the St. John river at this point.

**PORTAGE LA PRAIRIE, MAN.**—F. W. Clayton, City Clerk, wants tenders up to April 30th for laying of house sewer connections. Plans at City Engineer's office.

**PORT ARTHUR, ONT.**—The City

Council are about to consider the question of erecting a new police station.—Mr. McKinnon will erect a three storey brick 30 x 125 feet.

**ST. THOMAS, ONT.**—N. R. Darach, architect, wants tenders up to April 20th for erection of brick school house in Yarmouth Township. Plans at architect's office.

**PAISLEY, ONT.**—It is reported that the Bruce County Council will replace the bridge on the Saugeen river at Denny's dam with a new structure to cost \$15,000.

**EAST TORONTO, ONT.**—The Arcadia Lodge are considering the erection of a building.—The Town Council are considering the lowering of a number of water mains.

**REGINA, SASK.**—L. L. Kramer, secretary Catholic Separate School, District No. 13, will receive tenders up to April 17th for purchase of \$35,000 5 per cent. 30 year school debentures.

**CAMPBELLFORD, ONT.**—The congregation of the Methodist church have rejected the tenders received for erection of new building, and for the present will not take any steps in the matter.

**ROSTHERN, SASK.**—The ratepayers will shortly vote on a by-law to erect a new town hall at a cost of \$15,000.—The Union Supply Co. intend erecting a two storey brick block to cost \$18,000.

**THREE RIVERS, QUE.**—A by-law will shortly be submitted to the ratepayers providing for the granting of a bonus of \$75,000 to the Wabasso Cotton Co. who will establish a large plant in this city.

**NIAGARA FALLS, ONT.**—G. E. Will will erect a residence on Ryerson street.—J. Logan will erect a three storey brick block 27 x 90 feet.—W. L. Doran will erect a three storey brick factory 40 x 80 feet.

**GLAMIS, ONT.**—The Greenoch Township Council have decided to construct two steel bridges with concrete abutments over the Teeswater. Tenders for superstructures will be received up to April 22nd.

**QUEBEC, QUE.**—W. D. Baillairge, City Engineer, wants tenders up to April 17th for supply of broken stone, macadam,

stone curbing and other municipal supplies, also for construction of stone and brick pavements.

**GUELPH, ONT.**—The Dominion Government have decided to erect an additional storey to the Guelph Armoury.—L. C. Wideman, architect, is asking for tenders for erection of an addition to the Guelph Axle Works.

**BRANTFORD, ONT.**—S. Suddaby, Chairman Board of Works, will receive tenders up to April 18th for supply of sewer pipe, paving brick, special castings and lumber for the city. Information at office of City Engineer.

**ORILLIA, ONT.**—The Town Council have instructed the Board of Works to engage a consulting engineer to prepare plans for a sewerage system.—The Town Council have decided to enlarge the capacity of the reservoir.

**BERLIN, ONT.**—The by-law providing for the purchase of the Berlin & Waterloo street railway system by the city has been carried by the ratepayers. The purchase price is \$75,200 and debentures for this amount will be issued shortly.

**BELLEVILLE, ONT.**—F. Gelinas, Department of Public Works, Ottawa, will receive tenders up to April 24th for erection of drill hall in this city. Plans at office of W. R. Aylesworth, C.E., this city, and Department of Public Works, Ottawa.

**ST. ANDREWS, N.B.**—Application has been made to the Provincial Government by the Town Council for permission to issue debentures as follows: \$15,000 for an electric lighting system, \$5,000 for sewers and \$20,000 for improvements to the harbor.

**FORT WILLIAM, ONT.**—The Canadian Pacific Railway have intimated that they will construct a bridge over the Kaministiquia river at a cost of \$200,000.—The same company are considering the erection of a large hotel, car shops and other buildings.

**TRACADIE, B. C.**—F. Gelinas, Secretary Department of Public Works, Ottawa, wants tenders up to April 21st for construction of laundry building and septic tank. Plans with Dr. A. C. Smith, this village, and Department of Public Works, Ottawa.

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
