And then he withdrew.

The several documents accompanying the said Message, as, also the said several statements and estimates were then read by the clerk, and

On motion of Mr. PACK, seconded by Mr. MARTIN,

Ordered, that the said Message, Documents and Papers be printed for the use of the House.

Then the House adjourned until to-morrow, at twelve of the clock.
