



ITS PAYS TO BE GALLANT

This Man Protected a Woman, Now He's Worth \$200,000.

By Special Wire to the Courier. New York, May 3.—A despatch to The Herald from Philadelphia says: As a result of a bit of gallantry to a woman more than three years ago, Frank H. Canning, formerly of this city, and later of Clarksboro, N. J., is to receive \$200,000 as soon as he can be located. He is supposed to be working in an eastern powder mill and detectives are searching for him. Mrs. J. T. Elkins of Detroit, widow of a wealthy ranch owner, died several weeks ago, leaving an estate of \$400,000. Half of the money goes to Mr. Canning, the remainder to a charitable institution in Detroit. Mrs. Elkins was formerly Miss Irene Chadley of this city. Miss Chadley was returning to her home on a trolley car one night. She was the only woman on the car, the other passengers being half a dozen intoxicated men, and Mr. Canning. Suddenly a fight started, and one of the men brushed against Miss Chadley and threatened her. Canning placed himself in front of the woman and with the aid of the conductor managed to overcome the rowdies. Miss Chadley was so upset, that Canning called a cab and rode with her to her home.

MAD POLICEMAN

Ran Amuck With a Gun, Killing People, Before He Was Overcome. By Special Wire to the Courier. Shanghai, May 3.—A policeman named Chapel, armed with a rifle and seized with a mania to commit murder, began last night to chase and shoot people in the North Sze-Chuan road extension going through the international settlement, but runs through Chinese territory. The madman killed a young Chinese woman, a Chinese postman, a Portuguese clerk, a Japanese merchant and wounded fourteen others, including four women.

TELEGRAPHERS HAVE WON

Demands Will be Granted as Well as Those of Signalmen. By Special Wire to the Courier. New York, May 3.—The demands of telegraphers and signalmen on the lines of the New York Central and Nickel Plate Railroads for increased wages and better hours will not be granted, it was announced here today by A. T. Hardin, a vice-president of the New York Central. A strike would, according to the employees, involve 5,000 men had been set to begin some time tomorrow, but reasonable time will be granted to the railroad officials to give further consideration to the demands. Union officials who had not been informed of the announcement by Mr. Hardin, said that the next move by the employees would depend on the road's future attitude. LLOYD GEORGE MAY SPRING A SENSATION

Will Speak Saturday, and His Utterance Will be Frank. CONSCRIPTION HIS VICTORY Labor Dissatisfied and Wants Representation in the Cabinet. By Special Wire to the Courier. New York, May 3.—The London correspondent of The Tribune cables as follows: David Lloyd George is going to make a remarkably frank speech on Saturday, rivalling in interest his now famous "too late" address in the House of Commons last December. It is expected that his speech will have a direct bearing on his future official life, as well as lay bare Great Britain's position. Nothing of equal frankness has been said publicly by any cabinet minister since the war began.

HUNS ATTACKED IN THE ARGONNE

French Drove Them Back and Inflicted Heavy Losses. By Special Wire to the Courier. Paris, May 3, 12.20 p.m.—A German attack in the Argonne, near Harzeze was repulsed with serious losses for the assailants, the War Office announced this afternoon. In Verdun region last night there was heavy fighting with artillery. The text of the statement follows: "In the Argonne district, after a spirited bombardment with shells which released irritating gases, the enemy undertook yesterday evening a small attack in which three companies took part upon our trenches between Harzeze and Four de Paris. The Germans were successful in gaining a footing for a few moments in our advanced position, but they were unable to maintain their success and had to retire. They sustained heavy losses by our fire. "In the region of Verdun there has been fairly intense activity on the part of opposing artillery forces in the sectors of Dead Man Hill and Douaumont. One of our long range pieces bombarded the railroad station at Vignelles, waging and better hours will not be granted, it was announced here today by A. T.
