TWO AUSTRIAN COLUMNS

TORN TO PIECES BY ITA-
LIAN ARTILLERY.

ROME, February 12—The
Austrians yesterday renewed
their attacks on the northern
front, west of the Brenta River,
but were held in check by the
Italians. The Austrian columns
were torn to pieces by the Ita-
lian artillery and the attacks
were stopped, says today's of-
ficial report. The communica-
tion follows:—
"The increased fighting ac-
tivity continued yesterday mor-
ning on the southern slopes of
Monte Sasso Rosso, and east of
the Franzella valley. The en-
emy pushed forward important
infantry forces, which were lo-
cated in good time and decimat-
ed by our artillery so that they
could not develop any impor-
tant action.
"In the afternoon the situa-
tion was normal again."

PREDICTIONS THAT ARE

NEVER VERIFIED.

To the German editors who
complained that by next May
there would be no food in Ger-
many. Von Hindenburg re-
plied, "By next April I will be
in Paris." Two years ago the
German Crown Prince prom-
ised that he would take Verdun
in a few days. One year ago
Tirpitz and other German lead-
ers promised that the U boats
would reduce Great Britain to
starvation in six months.—Ex.

SEPARATE PEACE

WITH AUSTRIA.

LONDON, Feb. 13—Accord-
ing to the lobby correspondent
of the Daily Mail, facts are
known which bring the pos-
sibility of a separate peace be-
tween Austria-Hungary and
the Entente Allies much nearer.
Great reluctance, he says, is
manifested in Austria toward
the prospect of fighting British
and American troops on the
Western front.

GERMAN SUBMARINE SUNK

AND TWO MORE CAPTUR-
ED.

An Atlantic Port, Feb. 13—
An American steamship arriv-
ing here today reported having
sunk a German submarine in
the Mediterranean on Jan. 18
last after a running fight. The
steamer was not hit.
On the outward voyage the
same craft was attacked in the
Mediterranean by two subma-
rines. One was sighted off the
bow of the steamer, and when
the captain attempted to rain
the undersea boat it submerged
and made off. At the same
time the gun crew fought an-
other submarine from the
stern.
The crew of the vessel report-
ed that British patrol boats
captured two submarines off
the Canary Islands on Jan-
7.
