

EARTHQUAKE IN ECUADOR.

Three Shocks Felt at Quayaquil—Set Church Bells Ringing.

Quayaquil, Ecuador, June 3.—Three earthquake shocks on Saturday caused the inhabitants of this city to jump from their beds and run panic-stricken into the streets. en into the streets.

The first and last of the shocks were

slight, but the second was heavy and lasted about 40 seconds, causing the bells in the churches to ring and stopping the clocks in the church

towers.

No news has yet been received from the interior of the republic, but it is considered probable that damage was done by the earth shocks in the country.

Owing to the peculiar construction of the buildings, the disturbance did not cause any damage in this city.

The Oyster and the Cockle.

It was made a diplomatic engine of much significance and efficiency, In after times it often happened that the Roman envoys at the Persian court had misunderstandings more or less serious with the government to which they were temporarily accredited. When these ambassadors from Rome grew arrogant in their demands, it was the custom to conduct them into the presence of the stuffed skin of the exemperor of Rome, where they were asked if numility did not become them at sight of such a spectacle.
