PROBEAT JUDGMENT

Cotton Mills Company, the Queen's Bench Divisional Court gave judgment Tuesday, setting aside the non-asit entered by the late Sir M. C. Cameron, C. J., at the garing assisses, Hamilton, and ordered a new trial with coats in the case. The plaintiff, Dean, was employed in the cotton mills in that city, and under the Workman's Compensation for Injuries Act, 1886, brought an action for damages for injuries austained in December last by his falling into a kettle of scalding dye, upon which he was obliged in the ordinary course of his employment to stand, and which was not neoperly covered. At the trial the late Chief Justice held that as the plaintiff' previous to the injury had called the attention of the foreman of the day house to the defect in the covering, he was aware of the daspar, and by voluntarily continuing his employment he was willing to incur the risk, and that the case of Thomas ve. Quartermaine, in the Court of Appeal in England, was an authority upon the point. The judgment of the Divisional Court was feltivered by Mr. Justice Armour. The cort held that the English case was distinguishable from the present case in two essential particulars:

(I.)
