Admiral Foote Post, G. A. R., No.
17, of this city, has come into possession of quite a treasure in the shape of an old Confederate war chest, which was obtained under the following circumstances:

On Memorial day, 1875, when the post was engaged in decorating the graves of the soldiers in Grove street cemetery, they found a gravestone upon which was a Confederate flag, to which was fastened a card bearing the words, "Boys, take my flag," as if in token of surrender.

The grave was that of J. M. Pearl, who died in 1874, and who was formerly in the Confederate service. The grave was strewn with flowers by the boys in blue. In appreciation of this fraternal act J. L. Pearl, the father of the deceased Confederate soldier, who was himself a paymaster on the Confederate steamer Morgan, gave the Admiral Foote Post an old chest containing some very valuable papers.
