Millions on Verge of Starvation

in China.

Special Evening Telegram New York, To-Day. Three millions in Central China on the verge of starvation reads a statement issued by the China Famine Relief Committee: "Last summer the worst floods for forty years destroyed crops on an area of 50,000 square miles. Many have already died of hunger. Unless prompt relief is given, multitudes of men, women and children must perish. No harvest expected until May, when the famine will be growing daily more acute.'

His novels were free from the slightest tinge of immorality, and to quote the tribute paid by Thackeray, "could be safely put into the hands of his daughter."
