THE BELLONA AGROUND.

Montreal, Nov. 1.—The liner Bellona, from Montreal, for finer British ports, ran aground on Wednesday night in the Upper Traverse. The Bellona sailed from Montreal with a full cargo, Oct. 29. Tugs were dispatched to her assistance yesterday from Quebec. She is commanded by Captain Cunningham and was formerly known as the Waverly, having been built at Dundee in 1881. She is an iron crew steamer, 340 feet long, 40 feet 2 inches beam, 26 feet 8 inches deep, of 2,932 tons gross register, and 1,864 tons net. Her engines are of 320-horsepower. The Bellona carried no passengers. Her crew numbers about twenty men.

SURPLUS IN SIGHT FOR CITY COUNCIL

\$10,000 Expected to Show on Right Side of the Account.

FINANCE BOARD BEST

Expected That a Nest-Egg of \$9,000 Will Be Left for 1913.

The city council will finish the year with a small balance, but nothing to be compared to the record surplus of the council of 1911, who turned over \$45,000 to the incoming aldermen.

At the present time, the committees are finishing up their work for the year. The board of works will not do much more than ordinary repairs and the like from this time on. No more roads will be built, although Horton street will be put in shape for traffic, when the London Street Railway finish double-tracking there.

The engineer's department has had a busy season, a large number of sewers and walks being laid. In addition, 19 miles of streets have been oiled, and 7 miles scarified and leveled. The repairs have been extensive, although it is admitted there was not as much of this work done as there should have been. Scores and scores of holes and ruts make driving over the city rather precarious. However, some of these will be filled up before the end of the month. Contractors on walks and curbs have quit, owing to the frosty weather.

Not a Large Deficit. With all this work, the committee will not have an overdraft of any serious dimensions. The finances have been well conserved during the year.

In No. 3 committee there will be a small surplus. The street watering account was overdrawn, but the other accounts will be ahead.

The finance committee will have a good surplus. The expenditures have not been nearly so heavy as estimated, and the receipts have been larger than expected. There was a balancing account of nearly \$9,000, and this will be practically intact at the end of the year. The waterworks will show a surplus of \$2,000 more than was estimated, and this will make up for the deficits of all the other spending bodies.

Trustees Are Behind.

The board of education will have an overdraft of \$7,000, due altogether to the fact that the city solicitor would not allow the board to issue debentures for that expenditure. When the rate was struck, it was understood that this could be done. Later it was found out that it was impossible, and the trustees had to pay the money out of current revenue.

This overdraft will go as a legacy to next year's council, the board of education having to provide for it in 1913.

The hospital trust will have a small surplus, rather an unusual thing. They are generally somewhat behind on the season's business.

Altogether it is thought that the municipal finances will show a balance on the side of the ledger of \$10,000. Of course, the electrical department is left out of the reckoning altogether, as their surplus, if there is any, will be utilized in the department.
