CANADIAN BAYONET LACKS THE REACH

Germans' Weapon Nearly Nine Inches Longer—Austrians Is Shorter.

OTTAWA, April 9.—The following memorandum was issued tonight by the Military Department, apparently in reply to comments in letters received from Col. Currie, M.P., from the front: Articles have appeared in the press recently, attempting to point out the disadvantages of the Ross bayonet, with which the Canadians are armed, at the front, in comparison with other makes, particularly on account of length. The following information will, no doubt, be of general interest. Length of rifles and bayonets used by the principal nations at war are: Germany—rifle 4 feet 1.4 inches, with bayonet 5 feet 2.5 inches. Austria—rifle 4 feet 2 inches, with bayonet 4 feet 11.5 inches. Turkey—rifle 4 feet 0.6 inches, with bayonet 5 feet 5.5 inches. Belgium—rifle 4 feet 2.25 inches, with bayonet 4 feet 11.75 inches. France—rifle 4 feet 3.12 inches, with bayonet 5 feet 11.51 inches. Russia—rifle 4 feet 3.57 inches, with bayonet 5 feet 9 inches. Great Britain (short) Lee Enfield (rifle), 3 feet 8.5 inches, with bayonet 5 feet 1.7 inches. Canada—(Ross rifle) 4 feet 2.5 inches, with bayonet 5 feet 1 inch. It is interesting to note that the American rifle is 3 feet 8.72 inches long and with the bayonet, 4 feet 11 inches.

PETROGRAD, via London, April 9.—11:25 p.m.—The following Russian official statement regarding the fighting in the eastern theatre of the war was issued tonight:

"On the front west of the Niemen River there have been actions of secondary importance.

"In the Carpathians our troops repulsed a number of German and Austrian counter-attacks and continued to progress. We now hold in our hands the whole of the principal chain extending for more than 110 versts (about 73 miles), from Reghetovo to Volosate with the exception of Hill 909, south of Voliamekhova. On April 7 we took 1,200 prisoners.

"In all other sectors of our front there is no marked change."

WEST SEES BIG CROP

Increase of 20 Per Cent Looked for in Production.

London reports to Bradstreet's say that no new features have developed in the trade situation recently. Wholesale continue to receive a fair quota of orders from the country trade. Hardware manufacturers and wholesalers find orders rather backward at the moment.

Shortly the seed will be in the ground in areas exceeding former records and the West will feel that the first great step has been taken toward the most satisfactory soil conditions. The increase this year over last averages 20 per cent. Economy and self-reliance have prevailed throughout the West.
