Clarence Settell, Trusted Employee of Hydro Commission For Seventeen Years, Charged With Forging Check at Hamilton For \$30,000—Sir Adam Is Silent.

FAST LIVING IS BLAMED FOR DOWNFALL

Canadian Press Despatch. Toronto, Oct. 3.-Arrest this afternoon at the international bridge at Niagara Falls terminated the flight of Clarence Settell, for many years private secretary to Sir Adam Beck, and today, according to charges made, the forger of a hydro commission check for \$29,990, for which he secured the cash from the Canadian Bank of Commerce in Hamilton. At the time of his arrest Settell still had \$23,000 in his possession.

In the employ of the hydro commission since its inception 17 years ago, he was one of the best known and most popular of hydro officials. He had the full confidence of Sir Adam Beck, with whose work he was closely related.


