LAST CHANCE.

Chill Makes a Final Proposition to Argentine Republic.

Buenos Ayres, Dec. 13.—(via Galveston Texas)—Despatches received here from Santiago de Chile say that Senor Amunategui, minister of foreign affairs, handed to the minister of the Argentine Republic, Senor Portella, the basis of a new proposition to effect the liquidation of the dispute between the two countries. It is stated that Senor Amunategui has written a complaint to the authorities.
