"A Wrong That Should Be Remedied" Editor World: In these days we hear a grat deal about the "new woman" and her rights, and we see evidences that she is seeking equal rights in many things with the male section of the community. If she is entitled to the same privileges as men, by all means let the men have the same privileges and enjoy the same laws as she does. In one respect, that of the ownership of real property, married women now enjoy a privilege that we do not. A married woman can purchase her own real estate in Ontario, and can sell and dispose of it without the consent or concurrence of her husand can sell and dispose of it without the consent or concurrence of her husband, but a married man cannot sell or dispose of his real estate without his wife's bar of dower. Is this right or just? I submit, Mr. Editor, that it is a wrong that should be remedied as soon as possible. Let married men buy and sell real estate without any interference on the part of their wives. I would abolish the necessity of the wife's signature and bar of dower in conveyances and give them instead an absolute one-third interest in the real estate that their husbands own at the time of their likecase. Of course, if a husband providez for his wife in his will she has to elect between dower and what he gives her in the will in most cases. This has nothing to do, however, with what I complain of. 
