And I do not expect you, who will doubtless, I think, that the notion that the rich are rich because they have thrift, honesty, intelligence, strength, courage or any other virtue, is a very common notion, and you will marvel how such a preparation as this could possibly be maintained by any-day process of this.

Why, it is quite notorious that the humblest man works the most agreeable his work, and the more diligent, and that one of the chief attractions of being rich is having no need to work at all.
