BRADSTREET'S REPORT OF STOCKS. Total stocks in the United States and Canada, as reported by Bradstreet's on July 29, were 48,622,000 bushels.

Total stocks in the United States and Canada a year ago were 12,235,000 bushels, according to Bradstreet's report.

Pacific coast wheat stocks on August were 4,128,000 bushels, compared with 2,608,000 bushels a year ago.

THE VISIBLE SUPPLY.

The Chicago visible supply statement of stocks in the United States and Canada, east of the Rocky Mountains, for the week ended Aug, 5, was 37,166,000 bushels, being an increase of 1,147,000 bushels for the week. A year ago the visible supply was 8,254,000 bushels, two years ago 17,814,000 bushels, and four years ago 38,517,000 bushels.

STOCKS OF OATS AND CORN.

The visible supply of east in the United States and Canada, east of the Rocky Mountains is 4,512,000 bushels, compared with 8,440,000 bushels a year ago. The visible supply of corn is 10,461,000 bushels, compared with 17,575,000 bushels a year ago, according to the Chicago statement.
