PARLIAMENTARY REPRESENTA-TION.

The Trades Unionists of the Old World are evidently determined to allow me opportunity pass that can be made a means of furthering the purposes they have in view. Parliamentary representation of labor is regarded by them as a very powerful means, which they are disposed to use to the utmost extent. As evidencing their activity in this respect, we notice that at the half-yearly meeting of the Liverpool United Trades' Council, held at their hall on the 11th ult., the deput on from the Parliamentary Committee of the Council gave in their report of the interview with the Parliamentary Committee of the Liberal Working Men's Association, when the following resolution was proposed by Mr. Lowry, Conservative, and seconded by Mr. Ingles, Liberal:-

That this Council is pleased to learn that the Liberal Working Men's Association have resolved, under certain conditions, to support, at least, one of the Labor candidates about to be brought forward by the trades in connection with the Council, subject to the approval of the whole of the trade societies in Liverpool, but regret that such intention was not embodied in a resolution. Also, that no resolution was passed affirming that direct representation of labor is a necessity, for we believe that by no other means can the working classes obtain their legitimate rights, and protect their interest.

NUMBER ONE.

In the year 1723 there lived in Pesth, the capital of Hungary, Karol Kowates, a shoemaker whose ingenuity in cutting and carving on wood, &c., brought him into contact with Count Andrassy, ancestor to the present Prime Minister of Austria, with whom he became a favorite. The count, on his return from a mission to Turkey, brought with him a large piece of whitish clay, which had been presented to him as a curiosity, on account of Its extraordinary light specific gravity. It struck the shoemaker that, being porous, it it must naturally be well adapted for pipes, as it would absorb nictine. The experiment was tried, and Karol cut a pipe for the count, and one for himself. But in the pursuit of his trade he could not keep his hands clean, and many a peace of shoemaker's wax became attached to the pipe. The clay, however, instead of assuming a dirty appearance, as was naturally to be expected, when Karol wiped it off received, wherever the wax had touched, a clear brown polish, instead of the dull white it previously had. Attributing this change to the tint to the proper source, he waxed the whole surface, and polishing the pipe again, smoked it, and noticed how admirably and beautifully it colored; also, how much more sweetly the pipe smoked after being waxed. Karol had struck the philosopher's stone; and other noblemen hearing of the wonderful properties of this singular species of clay, imported it in considerable quantities for the manufacture of pipes. The natural scarcity of this much esteemed article, and the great cost of importation in those days of limited facilities for transportation, rendered its exclusively confined to the richest European noblemen, until 1830, when it became a more: general article of trade. The first meerchaum pipe made by Karol Kowates has been preserved iu the museum of Peath.


