POLLUTION

REPLY TO TELEGRAM OF CALGARY ASSOCIATION

On the orders of the day:

Hon. Jean-Luc Pepin (Minister of Energy, reply to a question addressed by the right hon. Leader of the Opposition to the Acting Prime Minister last Tuesday, as recorded at page 13963 of Hansard, regarding a telegram sent to the Prime Minister by Mr. Cronkhite, chairman of the Calgary Fish and Game Association. This telegram expressed concern at the cost of a sewage treatment plant in Calgary and requested senior government financial assistance.

I replied yesterday to the telegram, and among other things I said:

Federal government assists municipalities in construction of sewage treatment plants by making available low cost loans through Central Mortgage and Housing Corporation. These loans are for a maximum of two thirds the cost and extend for a period of up to 50 years. One quarter of loan is forgiven if project is completed on time.

My office called the mayor of Calgary on this subject and was advised that no application had been made for financial assistance from the federal government, since engineering and cost studies are only now in process, and since Calgary would not be prepared to proceed with the construction for at least another year.
