RESIDENTIAL REHABILITATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Question No. 4,846—Mr. Howie:

From April 1, 1980, how many existing housing units for native Indians in New Brunswick have been improved or repaired by Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation funding?

Hon. Roméo LeBlanc (Minister of Public Works): I am informed by Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation as follows:

CMHC funded the repair and improvement of 232 housing units on reserves under the Residential Rehabilitation Assistance Program from April 1, 1980 to April 30, 1983. CMHC does not maintain a record of native non-native clients served by the program off reserves.

CMHC—NEW HOUSING UNITS

Question No. 4,847—Mr. Howie:

Since April 1, 1980, how many new units of housing have been constructed for native Indians in New Brunswick?

Hon. Roméo LeBlanc (Minister of Public Works): I am informed by Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation as follows:

CMHC has not funded the construction of any housing units to Indians on reserve. CMHC does not maintain a record

of native/non-native clients under the Rural and Native Housing Program (Section 40 of the National Housing Act) that operates off reserve. However the delivery agent for the program in New Brunswick advises that 66 newly constructed houses have been provided to native clients.

CMHC—SENIOR CITIZEN HOUSING

Since January 1, 1980, how many loans were made for the construction of senior citizen housing projects in (a) Fredericton (b) York County (c) Sunbury County, New Brunswick?

Hon. Roméo LeBlanc (Minister of Public Works): I am informed by Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation as follows:

CMHC—CONSTRUCTION OF NURSING HOMES

Question No. 4,852—Mr. Howie:

Since January 1, 1980, what amount was loaned by the Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation in New Brunswick for the construction of homes to care for senior citizens?

Hon. Roméo LeBlanc (Minister of Public Works): I am informed by Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation as follows:

CMHC has not made any direct loans to nursing homes in New Brunswick since January 1, 1980. However, subsidy assistance under Section 56.1 of the National Housing Act at an estimated total of \$1.9 million per year has been approved for 490 hostel beds for nursing homes since January 1, 1980 in that Province.
