Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Honourable Senator King moved that the Bill (161), intituled: "An Act to provide for Family Allowances," be now read a second time.

After debate, it was—

Ordered, That further debate on the said motion be adjourned until to-morrow.

The Order of the Day being called for the consideration of the second and final Report of the Joint Committee of the Senate and the House of Commons on relations between the Federal Government and the City of Ottawa, it was—Ordered, That the said Order of the Day be postponed until to-morrow.
