framed in gilt; the pulpit is at the south-west corner, near the altar of the Virgin.

In addition to the church the parish owns a school house on the north, a presbytery on the south and a very

handsome and commodious presbytery on McCaul street, on the west. The latter was built in 1886, and is inhabited by the Redemptorist Fathers, who have charge of the parish interests.
