

Final Heats at Philadelphia

DULUTH BEAT ARGOS IN EIGHTS AND FOURS

Dibble and Butler Win and Lose in Turn—Final Heats at Philadelphia.

BOSTON CUP, Aug. 8.—The Dutchman, skippered by J. B. Dibley, won the shell crew, retained its title today by defeating the Argonauts of Toronto by half a length in 6:27-25 in the feature race of the 42nd annual regatta of the National Association of Amateur Oarsmen, rowed over the 1½ mile straightaway course on the Schuylkill River.

The Dutchman was a light-colored race from the Argonauts by three lengths. No time was taken because of a false start by the Dutchman and the Argonauts and Duluth, a restart being necessary.

Dutchman's champion Robert Dibley of Toronto again won the championship, beating Kelly of Philadelphia by half a length.

E. B. Butler of Toronto won the senior quarter-mile dash from Pearce of Philadelphia by one length.
