

THE SENATE OF CANADA

BILL W⁶.

An Act for the relief of Mildred Blanche Tilson Bell.

Preamble.

WHEREAS Mildred Blanche Tilson Bell, residing at the city of Verdun, in the province of Quebec, operator, wife of Victor Robert Bell, who is domiciled in Canada and residing at the city of Montreal, in the said province, has by her petition alleged that they were married on the nineteenth day of January, A.D. 1921, at the city of Westmount, in the said province, she then being Mildred Blanche Tilson, a spinster; and whereas by her petition she has prayed that, because of his adultery since then, their marriage be dissolved; and whereas the said marriage and adultery have been proved by evidence adduced and it is expedient that the prayer of her petition be granted: Therefore His Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, enacts as follows:—

Marriage dissolved.

1. The said marriage between Mildred Blanche Tilson and Victor Robert Bell, her husband, is hereby dissolved, and shall be henceforth null and void to all intents and purposes whatsoever.

Right to marry again.

2. The said Mildred Blanche Tilson may at any time hereafter marry any man whom she might lawfully marry if the said marriage with the said Victor Robert Bell had not been solemnized.
