Plan of Kerry and Chase Studied by Hamilton Waterworks Committee.

TO DIVERT SEWAGE Scheme to Establish Bathing Beach Held Up by Drainage System.

HAMILTON, Wednesday, Oct. 20.—The harbor commissioners' scheme to establish a bathing beach along the waterfront at Lansdowne Park may be held up for some time owing to the inability of the city engineers to divert the present drainage of the sewers into the bay at Wellington street.
