OBSERVATORY, TORONTO, April 13.—(8 p.m.)—The depression which was at night over the State of Kansas is now centred north of Lake Superior. It has caused showers in the lake region, and rain and snow in Manitoba. Elsewhere the weather has been fine, and for the most part milder.

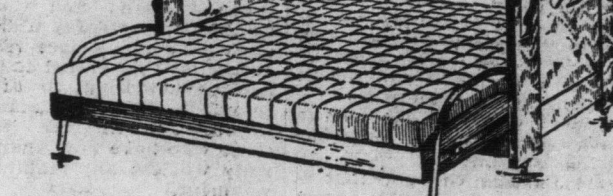

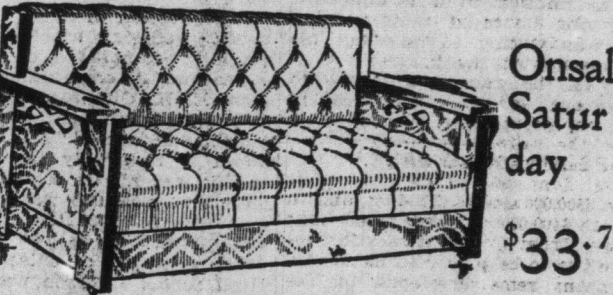

RABBI'S WARM REPLY

Proposal to Exclude Jews From Yacht Club Stirs Deep Feeling.

Rabbi Jacobs, preaching at the Holy Blossom Synagogue yesterday morning, referred to the statement in a local paper that in the Queen City Yacht Club a notice of an amendment was given to the effect that in future all Jews, negroes and people of other undesirable nationalities would be refused membership.

"One cannot help," said the rabbi, "pitying a man whose mind is so poisoned with racial dislike and whose intellect is so poor and impoverished and whose Christian faith and charity must be so small and narrow as to advocate this. One cannot help saying to him, 'Do you know your Saviour was a Jew and all the morality he taught was nothing but Jewish? Do you know that all the apostles and the early martyrs were all of the Hebrew race and carried out most of the teachings of Judaism? Why do you hate the Jew? Are not his domestic qualities proverbial? Do you excel him in temperance, in sobriety, or in any of the virtues which grace humanity? Is it sufficient reason to ostracize a man from any club or society merely because he is a Jew and loyal to the faith of his fathers?'"

OUR NEW SERIAL

"As a believer in Judaism," concluded the rabbi, "I would rather belong to a negro club, the members of which have white hearts, and without reproach, than be a member of a society of white men whose hearts are blackened with hate against their fellow-creatures on the score of creed or color, and who would raise the barriers of racial dislike and persecution in these days of liberty, of conscience and educational enlightenment."

Grenadiers Parade.

The parade of the Royal Grenadiers took place at the armories last night. Col. A. E. Gooderham was in command. Four hundred and twenty-five officers and men were on parade, which, considering the inclement weather, was a good turnout. The usual battalion company drill took place, and the smart appearance of Toronto's crack regiment was the general comment. The regiment has been fortunate in securing the services of Drum Major Hawes of the Coldstream Guards, and the sergeant-

instructor of H. M. Grenadier Guards. The regiment holds the highest average for marksmanship in the Dominion. The drum major is anxious to obtain the services of flute players and kettle drum players for the band.

CLEAN UP AT PORCUPINE.

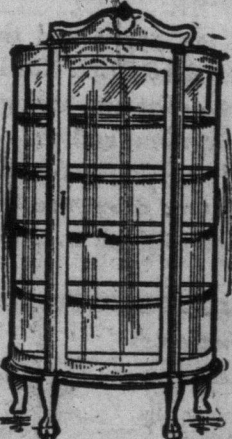

Ned Clarke's Strategy Failed.

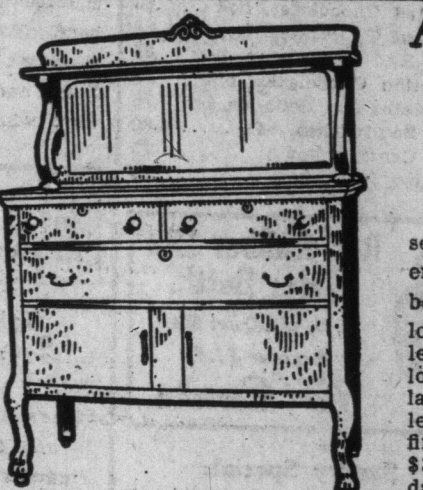

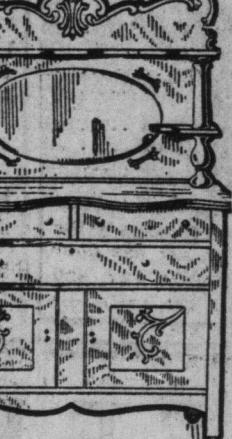

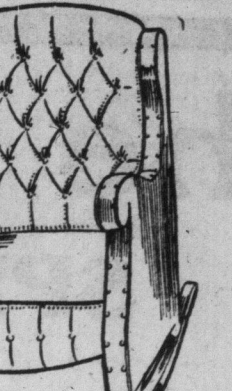
