

large and the entire allied troops were among them with grenades and bayonets before they had time to turn around. Many prisoners are coming in.

The entire allied troops are displaying the utmost fervor in the attack, their desire being to strike a strong blow in return for the recent German assault.

It is the first occasion this year that the entire allies have counter-attacked on such a big front. The operation directly affects the position of the German western flank and probably will cause the German crown prince to hurry some of his reserves to meet the onsets of the fighting from the Marne and the Champagne where yesterday and today everything was quiet.

The Germans have widely announced that their armies were engaged in a war of movement. This operation gives them the other side of the warfare in which the allies have taken the initiative.

Lightning-Like Diversion. On the French front in France, July 18.—With wonderful vitality and with spirits still high, notwithstanding the battle of the Marne, the American troops dashed forward at dawn today along the German front.

The depth of the advance cannot be exactly determined tonight, but it certainly is several miles in length. The allied commander-in-chief had permitted the enemy to exhaust a large portion of his forces in striking the blows on both sides of Rheims, which was intended to be heavy.

The blow was successfully parried, and before the Germans recovered sufficiently to fill the great gap in their ranks and make another effort, the allies bounded back and staggered them with a lightning-like diversion from the Marne to the Aisne.

Thousands of prisoners, scores of cannon, hundreds of machine guns and much other material fell into the hands of the allied troops. Besides gaining possession of the heights dominating Soissons from the south a couple dozen villages were reconquered by the army fighting which was engaged in severe fighting which disconcerted the enemy along the whole line from Chateau Thierry to Soissons.

Two Weeks Needed To Call A Strike. Montreal, July 18.—According to well-informed opinion in labor circles here, if a strike of railway shopmen occurs at all, it is doubtful if the order for it could be sent out within two weeks from the present date by the men's representatives now in Montreal.

The opinion of the men is being asked now on the present situation, but that situation will have changed by the end of next week when the amendments to the McAdoo schedule will be announced in Washington.

On those amendments further consultation is not gathered in before a week's time, it is not clear that a strike of one is especially called for, can be ordered at the earliest before a fortnight's time.

RHINE HOSPITALS FULL OF GERMAN WOUNDED. Geneva, Switzerland, July 18.—The German Empress, accompanied by Prince Joachim, has been visiting the hospitals in the Rhine towns since Sunday, says a despatch from Strasbourg by way of Basel. The hospitals are said to be crowded with wounded, mostly Prussian soldiers from the zone of the German offensive along the Marne, Bavarian and Saxon wounded are being sent into the interior.

The empress is reported to have broken down because of wounds so many wounded at Strasbourg. Large new wings, the advices say, are being added to the hospitals at Cologne and Mannheim. In the meantime the Wolff Bureau, the German semi-official news agency, continues to announce that the German losses have been insignificant.

FEW GERMAN AIRCRAFT DISCOVERED BY BRITISH. London, July 18.—The official statement on aerial operations issued tonight says: "On July 17 the weather was cloudy at first, but improved later, allowing a considerable amount of aerial reconnaissance, photography and artillery work to be accomplished by us. Eleven and a half tons of bombs were dropped during the day on enemy dumps and railways and on the Brangonville works."

"Comparatively few enemy machines were encountered. We shot down three and drove one down out of control. We lost one machine. We also shot down six hostile balloons in flames."

"Severe thunderstorms prevented our machines from carrying out night bombing."

IMMENSE BOOTY TAKEN IN ADVANCE OF ALLIES. With the American Army in France, July 18.—The American troops up to noon just south of Soissons had captured 3000 prisoners. Fifty cannon had been counted and thousands of machine guns.

Northwest of Chateau Thierry the Americans captured large numbers of prisoners and an equally important quantity of munitions and stores. The captures south of Soissons in the way of stores were immense and included such airplanes which the enemy was unable to remove, so swiftly did the storming troops sweep thru. Many prisoners and many guns still remain to be counted.

JUDGES HEAR COUNSEL ON HABEAS CORPUS

Legality of Cancellation of Exemptions Argued Before Supreme Court.

ORDER IS CHALLENGED. Deputy Minister of Justice Holds That Government Had Full Authority.

Ottawa, July 18.—Judgment may be given by the Supreme Court of Canada tomorrow afternoon in the important application for habeas corpus which will decide the question of the validity of the order-in-council promulgated on April 20, and involving the possibility of parliament being summoned in the event of the application being granted. Subsequent to over six hours argument pro and con by counsel, the supreme court at 6.30 this evening adjourned until 2 p.m. Friday, when it is expected judgment will be given.

The case for Pte. Edwin Grey, the applicant, was presented at length by Mr. F. H. Chrysler, K.C., Ottawa, Mr. Aime Geoffrion, K.C., Montreal, and Mr. R. B. Bennett, K.C., Calgary, and Mr. E. L. Newcombe, K.C., Ottawa, and Mr. J. C. P. Fitzpatrick, K.C., Ottawa, and Mr. W. N. Tilley, K.C., Ottawa.

Broadly speaking, counsel for the applicant maintained that the War Measures Act of 1914 does not delegate to the governor-general-in-council the power to amend the provisions of the Military Service Act by order-in-council.
