TWO FAVORITES OUT OF SIX FIRST ON OPENING DAY SOLON SHINGLE TO GETS AUTUMN CUP

Diamond and Boola Were the First Choices to Land—Thistle Do at 3 to 1, Bery Waddell and Factum, Each at 5 to 1, Were the Other Winners.

Under bright skies and conditions generally favorable, the fall meet of the Ontario Jockey Club opened most auspiciously on Saturday. While the attendance could not, of course, compare with that which marked the spring opening, in the absence of a feature like that of the King's Plate and the lack of a special presence to tempt society forth in its numbers, the gathering was nevertheless a large one, probably 10,000 people being drawn to the Woodbine. The crisp air, the generous flood of sunlight, the dashing music provided by the Grenadiers' band and the keen sport furnished all combined to make up one of the most successful opening days in the history of the O.J.C.

Favorites started off in fine style on opening day at the Woodbine. Diamond beat Cloten easily in the first race, and then Boola took the second, the Ontario Jockey Club's first race, in the back stretch and crossing in front. Thistle Do, second choice, beat Reservation, favorite, in the third, by a neck, and in the fourth, Inferno, at odds-on, ran disapparently in the feature race, in which Wexford was disqualified.
